### 2007-08 Season Continues with A Romantic Evening

The LaGrange Symphony Orchestra continues its seventh season under the baton of Patricio Cobos with "A Romantic Evening" on Tuesday, November 6, at 7:30 p.m. in Callaway Auditorium.

The program for this second concert in the symphony's 2007-2008 series of "Classical Sounds with a Southern Flair" will include the "Merry Widow Overture" by Franz Lehar and Mendelssohn's Symphony No. 3, the "Scottish Symphony." Also on the program will be a selection of operatic arias from Copland, Donizetti, Mozart, and Mendelssohn sung by featured baritone soloist Andre Chiang.

Chiang is the First Prize winner and recipient of the Dorothy Allen Turner Award in the LaGrange Symphony Orchestra's 2007 Young Artists Competition, held last February at Callaway Auditorium. A senior studying vocal performance at the University of South Alabama, Chiang has

performed with Opera Birmingham, the Mobile Opera and the University of Alabama Opera Theatre.

Tickets may be purchased from the symphony office prior to the day of the concert by calling 706.882.0662. Tickets will also be sold at the Callaway Auditorium box office beginning at 7:00 p.m. the night of the concert. Doors will open at 7:00 p.m. and concertgoers are encouraged to arrive early.

Adult tickets are \$25 for Mezzanine seating and \$15 for seats in the Orchestra and Gallery. Tickets for students sixth grade and older are \$5. Children fifth grade and younger are admitted free with an adult.

Season tickets are also available now through November 6 at a savings of ten percent off the price of individual tickets. If you haven't already purchased your season tickets for the 2007-2008 season, please consider doing so now at these reduced rates.

# George Henry Violin

George Henry, MD joined the LaGrange Symphony Orchestra as a violinist in 1996, shortly after he and Helen moved "back home." He began studying violin in fourth grade in Atlanta, continued in LaGrange with

William J. Deal, and joined the new Columbus Symphony Orchestra in 1953.

Dr. Henry attended the National Music Camp in Interlochen, MI, studied in college with John Adams and in recent years with Patricio Cobos. He was a charter member of the Emory String Society, forerunner of the Emory Symphony Orchestra. During psychiatric residency in Rochester, NY, George played in two community orchestras and for 30 years was a violinist with the Macon Symphony Orchestra.
